

A Bill to Lower the Corporate Income Tax Rate

1. Be it enacted by the Student Congress here assembled that:
2. Section I: The amount taxed on each Corporate Income bracket shall decrease by
3. 10%.
4. Section II: Corporate Income Taxes shall be defined as: “Taxes imposed by public
5. authorities on the profits of corporations.”
6. Section III: This bill shall take effect 60 days after passage.
7. Section IV: The Internal Revenue Service shall enforce the provisions of this
8. legislation.
9. Section V: All laws in conflict with the provisions of this bill are hereby declared
10. null and void.

A Bill Increasing Pigovian taxes

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Taxes on commercially sold taxable fuel shall increase by 40 cents per
3 gallon, and increase five cents per gallon for the next 12 years.

4 **SECTION 2.** All revenue collected from this bill shall be given as grants to private,
5 American companies who are researching carbon capture technology.

6 **SECTION 3.** A. Commercially sold taxable fuel shall be defined as any petroleum
7 product, regardless of refining, or natural gas to be used in internal
8 combustion engines.

9 B. Carbon capture technology shall be defined as any technology that
10 actively removes carbon from the atmosphere.

11 **SECTION 4.** The Department of Energy and Department of Transportation shall be
12 responsible for the enforcement of this bill. This tax shall be repealed if
13 America enters an economic depression.

14 **SECTION 5.** This bill shall go into effect on January 1, 2011.

15 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Create a Federally Funded School Voucher System

1. Be it enacted by this FFL Student Congress here assembled that:
2. Section 1: This Bill will award students of low-income families which score in
3. the top 2 percent on state-recognized standardized tests during their 8th grade year a
4. scholarship of \$30,000 to attend a private school.
5. Section 2: Low-income families shall be defined as families that are under the
6. federal definition of poverty as provided by the Department of Health and Human
7. Services. State-recognized standardized tests shall be defined as tests proctored by
8. each individual state to assess their students and schools. A private school is a school
9. receiving no government funding.
10. Section 3: The Department of Education will be responsible for the
11. implementation and enforcement of this bill. The Department of Education will take
12. scores once the present school year (2009-2010) has been completed and form the
13. budget needed for this bill. The Scholarship will begin from the 2010-2011 school
14. year.
15. Section 4: This bill will go into effect July 1, 2010
16. Section 5: All laws or portions of laws in conflict with the provisions of this bill
17. shall hereby be declared null and void.
